ABOUT THE **Area I** **Agency on Aging**

Area Agencies on Aging were created in 1973 under the Federal Older American's Act of 1965. We plan, coordinate and advocate for the development of comprehensive community-based service delivery systems to meet the needs of Older Americans. The focus of these systems is to:

- Provide a continuum of community based and in-home care for the vulnerable elderly, thereby avoiding premature or inappropriate institutionalization.

Area Agencies are the grass roots' administrators of the aging programs in their planning and service areas. The Area I Agency on Aging contracts with appropriate agencies in local county government to deliver services. Each county has a County Council on Aging which plans and oversees programs for the elderly in their counties.

SERVICES

Services are available to anyone sixty (60) years of age or older and their spouse regardless of age. Services under the Older Americans Act have no income guidelines. All programs are open to and encourage contributions by the participants.

The Area I Agency on Aging serves Carter, Custer, Daniels, Dawson, Fallon, Garfield, McCone, Phillips, Powder River, Prairie, Richland, Roosevelt, Rosebud, Sheridan, Treasure, Valley, and Wibaux counties and the Fort Peck Tribe.

Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Volunteers help Medicare beneficiaries understand their Medicare and other insurance paperwork, even complicated hospital bills and billing procedures.
